

Troop 166 Equipment List for 2 Night Winter Cabin Campout

- ___ FULL BSA UNIFORM (For travel)
- ___ BACKPACK (or Duffel Bag that can be carried).
- ___ SLEEPING BAG (35° or warmer)
- ___ RAIN GEAR – Waterproof rain suit with jacket and pants. (Breathable ones are best)
- ___ WARM JACKET or SHELL
- ___ WOOL SWEATER, and/or POLAR FLEECE SWEATSHIRT
- ___ LONG SLEEVE SHIRT (Wool or synthetic fiber for good insulating quality & quick drying).
- ___ 1-2 PAIRS of SNOW PANTS
- ___ EXTRA PAIRS OF PANTS (No cotton pants, like jeans)
- ___ LONG UNDERWEAR (if buying new, 100% Polypropylene, NOT cotton or cotton/ blend).
- ___ 1-2 extra sets of LONG UNDERWEAR
- ___ 2 REGULAR UNDERWEAR
- ___ 2 TEE SHIRTS (At least 50% poly)
- ___ STURDY BOOTS (No sneakers)
- ___ 3 pair HEAVY SOCKS – wool or wool blend preferred. No Cotton.
- ___ WARM HAT
- ___ SCARF and/or FACE MASK
- ___ WINTER GLOVES or MITTENS
- ___ SLEEPING CLOTHES - Dry clothes for sleeping only. Tee shirt, sweatshirt and sweat pants are all suitable.
- ___ MESS-KIT (bowl, cup, knife, fork, spoon, plate – Plastic/lexan is warmer than metal).
- ___ FLASHLIGHT (headband style keeps hands free – LEDs are great)
- ___ SLIPPERS or MOCCASINS (To wear inside cabin)
- ___ BSA HANDBOOK.
- ___ PEN, PENCIL, SMALL NOTEPAD
- ___ WATER BOTTLE or HYDRATION BLADDER, filled ("Nalgene" type bottles are very dependable).
- ___ CLEAN-UP KIT (Hand Soap, Toothpaste, Toothbrush, Comb, Floss, Fast-Drying Camp Towel).
- ___ PLASTIC BAGS (newspaper or plastic grocery bags to go under socks in case of wet boots).
- ___ SMALL FIRST AID KIT (Band aids and moleskin)
- ___ SUNSCREEN
- ___ SUNGLASSES or SKI GOGGLES

- ___ SMALL DAY PACK (optional)
- ___ POCKETKNIFE (optional)
- ___ CAMERA (optional)
- ___ HAND/FEET WARMERS (optional)
- ___ GAITERS (optional)
- ___ SMALL PILLOW (optional)
- ___ MEDICATIONS (if required)
- ___ SLED/TOBOGGAN (Optional but a good idea)

Tips

Stay away from Cotton clothes – they do not insulate when wet . Poly/cotton blends are better than 100% cotton if that is your only choice.

Always BE PREPARED for one season COLDER than now!

Pack your gear in plastic bags and put the plastic bags in your pack or duffel.
